It has to be said that although we were not able to carry out some of our normal gardening and plant maintenance in the parks – for example the weeding and pruning of the park house border in Alex Rec - the roses and other plants and flowers did not stop blooming and we still saw an amazing display there and throughout both parks this year.

We're pleased to report that, despite lockdown holding us back, there was still a lot planting and project activity in both parks. We hope that you have noticed our newly installed tree saplings. There have been 30 trees planted in each park, given to us by the Woodland Trust – a selection of Rowans, Silver Birches and Wild Cherry. Some of the committee and our regular volunteers have done an amazing job watering and caring for them during

the hot spells we have had. Unfortunately we've had a few casualties so if you are able, on any hot, sunny days why not take an extra bottle of water with you when you visit the parks and water any saplings or smaller trees you come across – every little helps!

Just before lockdown, in March, we saw the installation of a Cator Park bug hotel. The hotel is made up of pallets

and bricks stuffed full of organic matter to make life comfortable for our miniature park guests. The Hotel is now open for business and we're hoping to expand the chain to Alex Rec later this year!

And... that's not all that's new! In Alex Rec we've seen the completion of the mural around the bowling house. It now wraps around the entire building and is a bright and colourful new focus in the park – showcasing the park, its wildlife and its regular users like the Seymour Villa Football Club who helped to fund the project.
