Dear Friends, welcome to the Summer edition of our newsletter.



The Friends and volunteers have been busy in both parks throughout the Spring and early Summer planting new and donated roses and undertaking some very active weeding sessions to keep the park house border and sensory garden in Alex Rec and the newly planted shrub border in Cator Park tidy. We're pleased to report that the noticeboard in Alex Rec's children's play area has been repaired and the lettering of the water fountain repainted. We have also conducted a bench audit of both parks which notes that most need either a clean-up (including graffiti removal) or re-staining so we are looking at ways to have these renovated. The planters and obelisk kindly made by the Holiday at Home for the Over Fifties project at Holy Trinity Church have been installed in Alexandra Recreation ground and are looking great.



Call for watering in both parks: It's been a dry spring and our young plants and trees need everyone's' help to keep them hydrated. Please can we ask all our adopt-a-tree volunteers to continue their great work and, if visiting the parks, take some extra water and pour at the base of a young tree or plant to help us get through this dry weather. Talking of hydration we are actively pursuing the repair of the paddling pool for summer 2019 (including the aim of setting up a small working group to liaise actively with Idverde and Bromley Council to secure its long-term future) but sadly do not have anything definite to report at the time of going to press.

Onto events news: We've held two new events so far this year. The first - Easter in the Park - in Alex Rec back in April. There was glorious sunshine...so much so the Easter eggs were at risk of melting! 60 fabulous egg rocks were hidden for children to find in exchange for a chocolate egg and it was lovely seeing the children having so much fun. Our committee secretary Helen had everyone busy decorating biscuits and eggs at her crafts stall which kept the children all very entertained. There were even a few pawsome rocks for dog owners to find with a prize of a special doggy friendly carob egg for their furry friends.



Our second new event was Poetry in the Park – an evening of poetry was held on 26th July to celebrate London becoming a National Park City. The evening began with a poetry competition the theme of which was "Nature". We were looking for an original voice and a fresh and arresting use of language. The theme was interpreted in various ways and we were pleased to announce the following winners: First prize (£50) Bernice Carter for her poem "Cator Park", second prize (£25) to Foster Murphy for "Snow Talk" and third prize (£10) to Danny Turze for "The Nature of Nature". A special prize also went to seven-year-old Sullivan Whitney for "Save Nature".
